

Richie is an actor, writer, and improviser, living in New York City. In 2018, he starred with John Malkovich in a teaser on CBS before kickoff of the AFC Championship game that won four Sports Emmys. In July 2016, he performed at Just For Laughs in Montreal as part of "New Faces of Comedy: Characters." He can be seen recurring on Amazon's "The Tick," guest-starring on "The Last O.G." on TBS, "What We Do In The Shadows" coming soon to FX, and "Adam Ruins Everything" on truTV. Richie can also be seen on the Netflix hits "Unbreakable Kimmy Schmidt," "House of Cards," and "Orange Is The New Black," "Search Party" on TBS, "The Mysteries of Laura" on NBC, and "Power" on Starz. He also appeared in the Warner Bros films "How To Be Single" and "Going In Style." Richie also co-hosted a show on Comedy Central called "Cinema Social Club" with Jo Firestone and Seaton Smith.

From 2006-2010 he was on the mainstage cast at Improv Asylum in Boston's North End performing sketch and improv six times a week.
